



# Kiwi College English (Beginner)

### **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to assist students who have minimal knowledge of English to reach a level of English at which they can function mostly independently on a daily basis with a degree of confidence e.g. board the right bus, buy food, find their way around, be able to use greetings, be polite, etc. They will also be at a level where they are ready to enrol on the Elementary level course.

## Highlights

Read, identify and understand words, short sentences and basic texts. Write simple sentences in English using words in the correct order. Understand basic conversations on familiar topics in familiar contexts. Introduce oneself and interact with others using the basic English phrases.

# **Kiwi College English (Elementary)**

## **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to develop students' English language skills at a level so they can be confident in using English with native speakers.

Students should develop elementary English language skills and be confident in applying them to familiar topics and to understand how to use basic language for everyday tasks.

By the end of this course, they should operate more independently when performing more demanding tasks such as opening a bank account, making appointments over the phone, talking to their child's teacher, etc. They will also be at a level where they are ready to enrol on the Preintermediate English Language Course.



## Highlights

Read and understand the main points of short articles in newspapers and magazines and extract information from common source materials. Write short informal letters, messages, emails and descriptions of places and people. Understand clear and slow conversations on familiar topics in familiar contexts. Talk about oneself, initiate and join in discussions and participate in a conversation on familiar topics.

## **Kiwi College English (Pre-Intermediate)**



### **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to develop students' English language skills at Pre-Intermediate level, so they can communicate reasonably well, both orally and in writing and appropriately in real life situations. The course also prepares students to develop the ability to apply English language skills to new learning. On completion of this course students should be able to explain their opinions reasonably well and can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. There is an expectation that at this level they begin to identify and understand implied meanings and work with a greater degree of independence. They will also be at a level where they are ready to enrol on the Intermediate English Language course.

## Highlights

Read and understand general meaning of medium length texts; write medium length informal and formal moderately complex texts; participate in conversations on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. Follow a discussion between two or three people on familiar topics and understand general meanings.

## **Kiwi College English (Intermediate)**

### **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to develop learners' English language skills at an Intermediate level so they are able to communicate accurately and fluently in the classroom and social situations where they can express thoughts on more abstract, cultural topics such as films, books, music etc. Learners should be able to describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

On completion of this course students should be able to comprehend longer and more involved reading texts and listening activities and answer the questions involved with them. Their use of the correct grammar and vocabulary should be at a level at which we would expect them to be confident communicators in most social interactions.

## Highlights

Read to understand, summarise paraphrase and extract explicit and implicit information from a written argument or narrative text and from extended texts. Write detailed texts using correct layout, grammar, and vocabulary. Produce clear, detailed speech on a variety of subjects using appropriate language features. Listen for and understand main ideas from various sources on moderately complex topics.

# Kiwi College English (Upper Intermediate)

## **Programme overview**

The aim of this course is to develop students' English language skills at an Upper Intermediate level so they are able to communicate effectively and appropriately in real life situations. The course has been designed to prepare students to be confident and accurate users of English in all four English language skills.

It is expected that students who complete this course will be able to qualify their opinions to a degree at which they can answer spontaneously when asked questions. They will be applying their knowledge and their use of grammar with few errors and be able to give short presentations on a familiar topic to their classmates. It is expected overall fluency will be at the stage where they do not need to rely on their ethnic language for understanding the English equivalent of words or phrases.

At the end of the course they will have acquired the skills required to enrol on the Kiwi College English Advanced and IELTS Preparation course and will have acquired an English language proficiency level equivalent to an IELTS level of 5.5.

Present information logically, express thoughts and participate with degree of fluency in informal and formal settings. Use a wide range of vocabulary connected to topics of general interest.

## Kiwi College English (Advanced and IELTS Preparation)



### **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to develop students' English language skills at a level at which they can communicate effectively and appropriately in real life situations.

The course also prepares students to be confident and accurate users in all four areas of English language. Self-correction should be almost a natural reflex and they should be able to keep up and contribute equally to a conversation with three or more native speakers. They should be able to manage the same type of reading material as senior secondary school students and publications and websites in English will not present any problems for them. They will have acquired the skills required to achieve an IELTS score of 6.0.

## Highlights

Read complex texts quickly and effectively to find specific information and evaluate its relevance or importance. Plan, write and edit various types of texts using appropriate style and referencing. Understand explicit and implicit meaning of a wide range of spoken and written texts. Speak fluently on various topics and in more complex situations.

The aim of this programme is to develop students' English language skills and their ability to communicate clearly and confidently on familiar topics, and to participate, communicate and interact in familiar situations with some independence.

# New Zealand Certificate in English Language (General) (Level 3)

## **Programme overview**

The programme aim is to equip students with English language skills and tools to communicate clearly and confidently on reasonably familiar topics, and to participate, interact and communicate in most familiar situations with increasing independence and fluency.

Graduates of this programme will be able to understand main points and some specific details of oral texts on reasonably familiar topics, participate with some confidence in spoken discourse on reasonably familiar topics, understand main points and some specific details of written texts on reasonably familiar topics and write connected texts on reasonably familiar topics.

To equip learners of English as an additional language with the language skills required to participate with increasing independence and fluency in an academic language context.

## **Highlights**

Understand the main points and some specific details of moderately complex oral texts on reasonably familiar topics relevant to an academic context. Participate with some confidence in sustained spoken discourse on reasonably familiar topics relevant to an academic context. Understand main points and specific details of moderately complex written texts on reasonably familiar topics relevant to an academic context. Write clear connected text on reasonably familiar topics relevant to an academic context.

# High School Studies (Level 2)\*

## (Incremental Progression Pathway)

## **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to develop students' English language skills in applying them to familiar and unfamiliar topics and to understand how to use language for everyday tasks. Students will also learn to communicate reasonably well, both orally and in writing and appropriately in real life situations. The course also prepares students to develop the ability to apply English language skills to new learning.

Integrated learning connects the contexts of English with learning areas in social studies, science, biology, science and digital technologies. As students make connections across related contexts and learning areas, they draw on prior knowledge, skills and experience to develop new knowledge, skills, engage with learning and understanding of themselves as learners. In the last term of year 2, students will study NZCEL (General) (Level 3).

# High School Studies (Level 3)\*

## (Accelerated Progression Pathway)

## **Programme overview**

The aim of this programme is to develop students' academic writing and study skills, interpersonal and crosscultural communication, as well as broaden their knowledge and understanding of future study and employment options. In addition, students can apply their knowledge and skills in specific contexts such as business studies, information science or construction. This learning takes place during the first semester and is equivalent to the University Foundation Certificate (Level 3) programme of study.

In the second semester, students will focus on academic English and advanced study skills, study three more courses from a wide range of elective courses in the study areas of accountancy, business, science, information sciences, health sciences, and construction. The four courses students study during this semester is equivalent to the University Foundation Studies (Level 4) programme.

# **University Foundation Certificate (Level 3)**

## **Programme overview**

The primary aim is to prepare students who plan to study New Zealand qualifications at NZQA level 4 and above but do not have any background knowledge, experience or proficiency for academic tertiary study in the New Zealand context. The aim is to provide students with the skills, capabilities, knowledge and attributes needed to progress and succeed in their field of study and/or employment pathway in New Zealand particularly in the construction, information science or business study fields.

In this programme, students will learn to:

- Manage own learning and work effectively as an individual and as a team member to achieve relevant goals.
- Identify and apply knowledge from a variety of specialised sources to context-relevant tasks and problems.
- Solve problems relevant to their chosen fields and communicate solutions effectively, using appropriate methods and media.
- Evaluate opportunities and develop a plan(s) in a field of study and employment pathway relevant to their chosen field(s) that considers the unique qualities, skills and strengths that define their rangatiratanga/self-management.

### **Programme overview**

The programme is a stepping stone into the world of higher education, particularly for young international students who do not have the right qualifications to go straight onto a tertiary programme of study.

The aim of this programme is to equip students with the attributes, knowledge and skills needed to prepare them for higher level, including degree level studies, leading toward a chosen field of study or career pathway.

The programme is also ideal for students who are unsure whether they want to go to university. They can get an understanding of their field of interest before progressing to a full degree programme.

As well as subject knowledge, they will get used to the higher education context and gain the skills needed for higher level study. If they successfully complete the foundation programme, they can be accepted into the first year of a diploma or degree programme.
